

1. Q Okay, were the police taking a lot of statements around the  
2. town and around the neighborhood?  
3. A Yes sir.  
4. Q Talking to a lot of different people?  
5. A Yes.  
6. Q And did you tell this to Willie Robinson?  
7. A Yes sir.  
8. Q Uh, did he pay you or promise you anything to get you to  
9. make the statement?  
10. A No sir.  
11. Q Had, on that morning of July 12, 1989 except for that time  
12. that you saw them when the, do you identify the time with  
13. when the places were closing down or had closed down in  
14. town? Is that how you identify the time period?  
15. A Yes.  
16. Q You weren't actually keeping time on your watch or anything?  
17. A No.  
18. Q Had you seen them together before that or any time after that  
19. or was it just that time period?  
20. A Just that time.  
21. Q Beg the indulgence of the Court. ... Have you been convicted  
22. of a crime in this court that you plead guilty to?  
23. A Yes.  
24. Q What?  
25. A Distribution of cocaine.  
26. Q When was that?  
27. A October the 12th.  
28. Q Of what year?  
29. A '89.  
30. Q '89? Was any promise or anything made to you in connection  
31. with that particular charge to, uh, if you give a statement

1. A I think so.  
2. Q Okay, you don't know?  
3. A I was indicted, yes, but he, he wasn't the officer that  
4. picked me up.  
5. Q Well, okay...well you'll need to say I don't know if you  
6. know you were indicated, don't you?  
7. A Yes, I know I've been indicted.  
8. Q All right, then. Was he the officer who, who uh, supposedly  
9. did the investigation on the dope case?  
10. A I'm not sure.  
11. Q Okay. And your testimony in response to Mr. Coenen's  
12. question was that you haven't been promised any deal or  
13. anything like that to testify in this case?  
14. A No.  
15. Q Okay, but you do expect, uh, do you know what you can get  
16. for ditribution of cocaine?  
17. A Yes.  
18. Q What can you get?  
19. A Five or more years, five up to thirty.  
20. Q Up to thirty years?  
21. A Yes.  
22. Q But you wouldn't expect after testifying in this trial that  
23. you would get thirty years, do you?  
24. A I don't know what they gonna give me.  
25. Q But you wouldn't expect it, do you?  
26. A I don't know.  
27. Q But you don't expect it, do you?  
28. A I don't know.  
29. MR. COENEN:  
30. I object, it's been asked and answered.  
31. THE COURT:  
Sustained.

1. Q All right, so you testifying you brought forth this informa-  
2. tion to testify in this case out of the goodness of your  
3. heart?  
4. A Right  
5. Q Right?  
6. A Right.  
7. Q Okay. Now you indicate you had been drinking that night.  
8. Is that true?  
9. A Yes.  
10. Q Do you remember what you had been drinking?  
11. A Yes.  
12. Q What had you been drinking?  
13. A Budweiser and Hennessay and sprite.  
14. Q All together or different times or what?  
15. A Different times.  
16. Q Now when did you start drinking this Budweiser and Hennessay?  
17. A I don't remember. I know the happy hour started, ladies  
18. night started at eight o'clock.  
19. Q Okay, so where was this? Ladies night at where?  
20. A A club called P.J.'s which is Willie's Lounge right now.  
21. Q Uh-huh, and...Willie's Lounge? That's not this Willie, is  
22. it?  
23. A No.  
24. Q Okay, you, uh...so you had been drinking from eight o'clock  
25. at night?  
26. A I started drinking at eight. That's what time it started.  
27. Q When did you stop drinking?  
28. A I don't remember.  
29. Q Okay, you never stopped, did you? You drank from eight  
30. o'clock that night until one o'clock that morning, didn't  
31. you?
